HM Young Offender Institution HMYOI Cookham Wood

Summary of questionnaires and interviews: Children and young people's self-reported perceptions 16 – 17 October 2012



Introduction

HM Inspectorate of Prisons has conducted surveys of children and young people (aged 15–18) held in prison custody, in collaboration with the Youth Justice Board (YJB), since 2001. As part of a service level agreement (SLA) between HM Inspectorate of Prisons and the YJB, each establishment holding children and young people is now surveyed on an annual basis. The objective of the survey is to give young people the chance to comment on their treatment and conditions in custody, as part of the evidence base for HM Inspectorate of Prisons and the YJB.

This summary provides young people's self-reported experiences and perceptions within HMYOI Cookham Wood. It includes a description of the survey methodology, a description of how the data has been analysed and the survey results.

In addition to these stand-alone summaries, the data from all surveys conducted each year is also collated and presented in a report which is produced annually. This is a detailed report that includes a year-on-year comparison of survey data, a breakdown across establishments and diversity analyses.

Although this survey was conducted solely as part of the SLA with the YJB, in some instances, as well as being published as a stand-alone summary report, and in the annual report, the survey data collected are used in inspections. During inspections, findings from the survey are triangulated with inspectors' observations, discussions with young people and staff and documentation held in the establishment.

Survey methodology

A voluntary, confidential and anonymous survey of the population of children and young people (15–18 years) was carried out by HM Inspectorate of Prisons.

Selecting the sample

At the time of the survey on 16 October 2012, the population of young people at HMYOI Cookham Wood was 117. The sample size was 117. Overall, this represented 100% of the population of children and young people.

Refusals were noted and no attempts were made to replace them.

Interviews were carried out with any respondents with literacy difficulties. In total, three respondents were interviewed.

Methodology

Every attempt was made to distribute the questionnaires to each respondent on an individual basis. This gave researchers an opportunity to explain the independence of the Inspectorate and the purpose of the questionnaire, as well as to answer questions.

All completed questionnaires were confidential – only members of the Inspectorate saw them. In order to ensure confidentiality, respondents were asked to do one of the following:

- have their questionnaire ready to hand back to a member of the research team at a specified time
- seal the questionnaire in the envelope provided and hand it to a member of staff, if they were
 agreeable, or
- seal the questionnaire in the envelope provided and leave it in their room for collection.

Respondents were not asked to put their names on their questionnaire, although their responses could be identified back to them in line with child protection requirements.

Response rates

In total, 97 respondents completed and returned their questionnaires. This represented 83% of children and young people in the establishment at the time.

Nine respondents refused to complete a questionnaire, four questionnaires were not returned and seven were returned blank.

Comparisons

Presented alongside the results from this survey are the comparator figures for all children and young people surveyed in young offender institutions. This comparator is based on all responses from surveys carried out in the other 10 male establishments surveyed since April 2011. Within the statistical analyses all data has been weighted in order to mimic a consistent percentage sampled in each establishment.

A further comparator compares the responses of young people in 2012 against the responses of young people surveyed at HMYOI Cookham Wood in 2011. It should be noted that, in order for statistical comparisons to be made between the most recent survey data and that of the previous survey, both sets of data have been coded in the same way. This may result in percentages from previous surveys looking higher or lower as some of the survey questions may have changed. However, both percentages are true of the populations they were taken from, and the statistical significance (see below) is correct.

On occasion, the analysis comparing the most recent survey findings to the previous survey findings at an establishment will be different in the stand-alone findings document and in the appendices of an inspection report. This occurs when the current survey is being used for an inspection but the previous survey carried out at the establishment was not; for inspection purposes it is more helpful to compare the current survey to the survey that was carried out for the last inspection and so this version will appear in the inspection report, while the comparison between the current survey and the last survey at the establishment will appear in the stand-alone document.

In addition, the following analyses were conducted:

- A comparison within the 2012 survey between the responses of white young people and those from a black and minority ethnic group.
- A comparison within the 2012 survey between the responses of Muslim young people and non-Muslim young people.
- A comparison within the 2012 survey between the responses of young people who consider themselves to have a disability and those who do not consider themselves to have a disability.

In all the above documents, statistically significant differences are highlighted. Statistical significance indicates whether there is a real difference between the figures, i.e. the difference is not due to chance alone. Results that are significantly better are indicated by green shading, results that are significantly worse are indicated by blue shading, and where there is no significant difference there is no shading. Orange shading has been used to show a significant difference in demographic background details.

Some questions have been filtered according to the response to a previous question. Filtered questions are clearly indented and preceded by an explanation as to which respondents are included in the filtered questions. Otherwise, percentages provided refer to the entire sample. All missing responses are excluded from the analysis.

Summary

In addition, a summary of the survey results has been included, which shows a breakdown of responses for each question. Percentages have been rounded and therefore may not add up to 100%.

No questions have been filtered within the summary so all percentages refer to responses from the entire sample. The percentages to certain responses within the summary, for example 'not sentenced' options across questions, may differ slightly. This is due to different response rates across questions, meaning that the percentages have been calculated out of different totals (all missing data is excluded). The actual numbers will match up as the data is cleaned to be consistent.

Percentages shown in the summary may differ by 1% or 2% from that shown in the comparison data as the comparator data has been weighted for comparison purposes.
