# Her Majesty's Crown Prosecution Service Inspectorate Follow-up inspection of CPS Leicestershire and Rutland

### **CPS Leicestershire and Rutland makes good progress**

HM Crown Prosecution Service Inspectorate (HMCPSI) has today published its follow-up inspection report on the inspection of CPS Leicestershire and Rutland.

HM Chief Inspector, Michael Fuller QPM, said:

"CPS Leicestershire has continued to move forward since the inspection in 2009. There has been significant progress in implementing our recommendations and it is a credit to staff that progress has been made in this way."

Summary of main inspection findings:

- The area had made substantial progress in implementing 3 out of 4 recommendations made in the 2009 inspection and fully achieved the fourth.
- The quality of work going to the Crown Court has improved as the area has worked to address our recommendations.
- The area has worked with the police to ensure that staff in the Witness Care Unit are better trained,
- The area has made good progress in addressing the aspects for improvement that were also identified, although more progress needs to be made to ensure lessons from casework are learned.
- The strengths that were identified during the 2009 inspection have been maintained.

#### **Notes to editors**

- 1. HM Crown Prosecution Service Inspectorate is an independent statutory body established by the Crown Prosecution Service Inspectorate Act 2000, which came into force on 1 October 2000. The Chief Inspector is appointed by, and reports to, the Attorney General.
- 2. CPS Leicestershire and Rutland was the subject of a full area effectiveness inspection in 2009. The inspection rated performance as fair. A follow-up inspection took place in July 2010.
- 3. The purpose of the follow-up visit was to assess the progress made against the recommendations and aspects for improvement contained in the 2009 report. We also evaluated whether the strengths in performance remained.
- 4. The inspection team comprised a legal and business management inspector.
- 5. CPS Leicestershire is one of 42 CPS areas, each of which has a chief crown prosecutor, and serves the area covered by Leicestershire Police.
