HMIC Best Use of Stop and Search (BUSS) scheme revisit assessment

Further to HMI Cunningham's letter dated 12 October 2016, I am writing to inform you of our assessment of your force's compliance with the Best Use of Stop and Search (BUSS) scheme. The revisit was carried out between 3 November 2016 and 24 November 2016, and included a review of your website and force documentation and consultation with relevant staff. Thank you for the assistance provided by your staff.

HMIC's 2015 legitimacy inspection found that your force was not complying with two features of the scheme: recording and publishing outcomes including showing the connection between outcomes and objects, and monitoring the impact particularly on black, Asian and minority ethnic people and young people. I am pleased to confirm that our recent revisit has found that the force is now complying with these features of the scheme. Our detailed assessment is set out at Annex A.

	<p>The force monitors data in respect of ethnicity and age.</p> <p>However, its analysis and subsequent monitoring could be enhanced by monitoring data on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the reason for searches (e.g. drugs) by ethnicity and age; • the rate at which the item searched for is found, by ethnicity and age; and • individual officer/team data – totals, outcomes and find rate, by ethnicity and age.
